
Financial overview



Earned Revenue \$192,292 | 2014-15 \$171,194

Our student fees are based on a sliding fee family income scale. We've always used this scale because we believe that all children regardless of their financial means ought to be able to participate in the arts. Revenue is also generated from tickets sales from students performances. We also offer programs for youth like Birthday Parties, summer classes and adult classes which are not based on the fee scale. On site you'll also find *The Best Little Dance Store* and a self-serve cafe. Our earned revenue is higher than our peer organizations which shows we take sustainability seriously.

Expenses

Payroll \$240,679

The biggest piece of the pie represents the heart of our programs—the people who are passionate about the arts and the children we serve. We employed 31 dance, art and theater instructors.

Program Supplies & Marketing \$37,002

includes purchasing costumes for our students so the high price of those glittery tu-tus don't become a barrier to participation for low income children. Also includes buying scripts, music licensing and quality art materials.

Rent and Maintenance \$37,002


We're the anchor tenant in the ART 634 building where other artists and creative types work.

This is to stabilize our finances by providing a "rainy day savings account" for unexpected cash flow shortages, expense or losses.

- 903 children & youth participated in year round arts programming in 207 different long term classes.
- 2 8 schools and partner organizations hosted our programs in 2015-16 bringing the arts directly to 5 1 8 more children and youth throughout Jackson County.
- 3 You provided professional development for our artistic director to travel to Pittsburgh and Detroit to learn the latest techniques in Acrobatics and Contortion (think Cirque du Soliel) to share with our students.
